LIMA LADS AND LASSIES 4-H CLUB

July is turning out to be a busy month for the Lima Lads and Lassies 4-H club. Early in the month the Buffalo County Extension put together a 2022 STEAM Discovery Day for youth in grades K-6 and kids from Pepin County were invited to attend. It was held at the Mirror Lake Pavilion. From our club Nick and Leah Brion joined in on the learning experience. Eight projects were taught some of which were making mazes, water balloon painting, hydraulics, architecture, soap making and CD print making. Nick's favorite was the hydraulics and Leah's was the architecture. They enjoyed their afternoon of learning new activities.



The Buffalo/Pepin County Fair is coming up the first weekend of August and one of the projects is the Foods Review which is held at the Martin Center 2 weeks before the fair. From our club Elizabeth Menting, Elizabeth Wayne and Isabella Wayne entered the competition. The girls thought the judge was very fair, super nice and very knowledgeable in her judging of all the entries. The judge was very interested in the uniformity of the cupcakes. She told the entrants that they had exhibits showing a high quality of work. While working on their projects, Elizabeth Menting learned how to keep the papers from separating from the cupcakes by letting them cool before covering them, that decorating her cake took longer than she anticipated, how to mix colors to get the hue that she wanted and how to use the frosting decorating tips. Elizabeth and Isabella Wayne felt the hardest part about decorating their cupcakes was battling the heat and keeping the frosting cold enough to get good piping designs on their cupcakes. The younger age group had a lot of competition. Elizabeth Wayne made cookie monster cupcakes and earned a White ribbon. Isabella Wayne made cherry pie cupcakes and earned a Blue ribbon and a Merit ribbon. Elizabeth Menting made a decorated cake and earned a Blue ribbon and a Merit ribbon. They should be very proud of their exhibits!

We had our monthly meeting and it was all business this time. We made a donation to the Fill-A-Bookbag program, handed out birthday cards to club members, made plans to sell desserts at the Music in the Park on July 26, and discussed all things pertaining to our upcoming fair. Our members have entries in beef, dairy, sheep, exotic animals, cultural arts, plants and photography to name a few. Please join us at the Buffalo/Pepin County Fair in Mondovi on Aug 5 - 7. 3. Your Reflections – the BIG picture

 - c. What would you do different?
 - d. How has being a 4-H member helped you set goals and develop new interests?
 - e. How has 4-H influenced your future goals (personal and/or career)?
4. Outreach - How did you help your club and/or county grow? (Community service, team work, leadership, etc.)
5. Value
 - a. Money made, personal time, personal value, etc.
 - b. What are you most proud of and why?
6. Parent and/or 4-H Club Leader Statements – Please have your parent and/or 4-H Club Leader write a few sentence about their thought of your 4-H journey this year. The statement should be signed by the Parent or 4-H Club Leader.



- All exhibits/entries must be checked-in using the barcode scanners at designated locations throughout exhibit buildings.
- After exhibit/entry has been checked-in, must place in appropriate section according to department, class and lot for judging. Look for color coded placement signs.

MADISON, Wis. – The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) announces that the statewide order prohibiting movement of poultry to all live events has been lifted. The order had been in effect since May to prevent the spread of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) in Wisconsin.

While poultry is now permitted at live events, DATCP continues to encourage strong biosecurity practices including cleaning and disinfecting, restricting access by visitors and wild birds, and keeping separate shoes and clothes to wear around flocks. Since March, 22 domestic flocks in 14 Wisconsin counties have been confirmed with the virus, and states continue to identify new infections at backyard and commercial farms.

Poultry owners should continue monitoring their birds for increased mortality or signs of illness. Reports can be submitted to DATCP at (608) 224-4872 (business hours) or (800) 943-0003 (after hours and weekends).

DATCP also reminds poultry owners to [register their premises](#). State law requires that all livestock owners register where their animals are kept, and registration helps animal health officials communicate with flock owners during disease outbreaks.

2022 Buffalo County Fair Camping Rules and Regulations:

1. Youth animal exhibitors and fair board members and their families are the only eligible members to register and stay overnight in the Buffalo County Fair Camping sites. There is a maximum of eight campers per lot.
2. Each assigned site must have an adult who is responsible for all people and equipment in the camping lot. The adult must stay overnight in the camping area each night of the fair. The adult must be 21 years of age or older.
3. Camping sites will be assigned to you by the Buffalo County Fair Staff. Notification of your site number will be after July 17th. Only one camper and/or tent is allowed per camping site.
4. Lots are available Tuesday August 2nd 2022 - Monday August 8th 2022. The Fair Staff will contact you when spots are ready.
5. Camping sites are to be kept clean of trash/rubbish at all times.
6. Open fires are not permitted on the camp sites.
7. Use or possession of narcotics, illegal drugs, or use of vulgarity is prohibited.
8. The Buffalo County Fair assumes no responsibility for damage or injuries to campers.
9. There is a 1:00 am quiet-time rule in effect in the camping area. Campsites will need to have all loud music off and keep conversations low at this time.
10. When setting up please stay within your lines as the sites have limited space.
11. Please keep fire lanes and access areas around the buildings/barns open.
12. Parking in the camper area is limited to ONE vehicle per campsite. Please do not park in another campers lot.
13. Only the entrance by the beef barn is to be used for coming and going after the fair has started. (DO NOT USE the entrance by the beer garden once the fair has started.
14. No parking signs will be in place, if you move them to get in or out of the camping area during the fair please put them back when leaving and returning to the fairgrounds.
15. The Rabbit/Chicken barn is the storm shelter for all those camping at the fair.
16. Fair Association members, Fair Staff, and Law Enforcement have the authority to close and evacuate any camping lot as they deem necessary.
17. Non-compliance with these rules and regulations could result in permanent removal from camping at the Buffalo County Fair.

2022 Buffalo County Fair Special Notes:

1. If you travel a far distance to camp and show animals make sure that you get your registration and payment in early. i.e. May 1st, to ensure you get a site.
2. Camping will be done as to the size of the camper to accommodate as many as possible. Please be sure that when you submit your registration form that the size listed is what you are bringing. Please measure tip to tip and full width of the camper with slides fully deployed.
 - a. **IF YOUR CAMPER DOES NOT FIT DUE TO INACCURATE MEASUREMENTS YOU WILL BE ASKED TO REMOVE THE CAMPER FROM THE FAIRGROUNDS.**
3. If you are within 10 miles of the Buffalo County Fairgrounds you may be placed on a waiting list if camping sites are full. Please still be sure to send in your registration as something might be available for your camper size.
4. **Registration starts May 1st 2022 Early Registration ends June 19th 2022 Final Registration ends July 3rd 2022.**
5. **If you do not register and pay by the Early Registration date of June 19th 2022 you will automatically be placed on the waiting list and there will be a \$50 additional charge for your camping site.**
