
are covered by secondary liability insurance. All adults who wish to work with youth in the 4-H program will be required to go through the screening/trainings. Check out this for more information on



Lima Lads and Lassies 4-H Club Notes

It was a hot one at the Buffalo County Fair this past weekend. There was lots to see and do. It started with project check in on Wednesday night and Thursday morning. You could feel the excitement in the air as kids were placing their projects in the right area for judging and were eyeing up their competition! We had four exhibitors in the beef division this year with Isabella and Elizabeth Wayne and Dylan and Drew Jereczek. Kris Wayne and her dad, John Wayne, showed a cow calf pair in the 4-H Alumni Show by using animals owed by Isabella and Elizabeth Wayne. We had five exhibitors in the sheep division with Mara, Jacey and Corrina Brunner, Jodi Vetterkind and Sami Poeschel. Jodi and Sami did the Managerial Program by using sheep that were owned by Joel and Carrie Brunner. The Brunner girls showed their sheep in the market category so they sold their animals in the auction Friday night. Mara's sheep weighed 110 lbs and was purchased by Eau Galle Cheese for \$17.50/lb. Jacey's sheep weighed 109 lbs and was purchased by Brunner's Seed for \$20.00/lb. Corrina's sheep weighed 120 lbs and was purchased by Johnson Tractor for \$15.00/lb. Isabella Wayne sold her steer in the auction weighing in at 1145 lbs to Gunderson Food for \$3.75/lb. Elizabeth Wayne's steer was awarded the Reserve Champion Steer weighing in at 1296 lb and was sold to Johnson Tractor for \$5.00/lb. Elizabeth Wayne was named Reserve Intermediate Showman. Dylan Jereczek sold his steer weighing in at 1480 lbs to First Choice Dairy Supply for \$4.00/lb. Drew Jereczek sold his steer weighing in at 1318 lb to First Choice Dairy Supply for \$6.00/lb. Drew was named Reserve Junior Showman. Thank you to all the businesses that came to the auction to bid on these well taken care of animals. After the full weekend of taking care of their animals the Herdsmanship Awards were given out on Sunday afternoon and our sheep entry earned the blue ribbon.

In the rest of the exhibit buildings our other club members had several projects in all kinds of categories. Jodi Vetterkind, Sami Poeschel, Isabella Wayne, Elizabeth Wayne, Drew Jereczek, Briar Schatner, Jacey Brunner, Corrina Brunner, Alivia Hurtgen and our club booth all earned Award of Merits for some of their projects. Jodi Vetterkind walked away with the most Award of Merits. She earned a Judge's Favorite with a binder full of pressed Wisconsin Flowers. Sami Poeschel earned Reserve Best of Show for her drawing. Isabella earned Best Dried Arrangement for her flowers. Drew earned Best of Show for his flowers. Briar earned Best of Show for her outdoor decoration of a frog made from clay pots. Oakley Hurtgen, AJ Poeschel and Leah Brion all showed projects in the Cloverbud division. It was a great weekend at the fair. I hope you join us next year.

Club History

In 1964 when the Lima Lads and Lassies 4-H Club started one of the leaders was Richard Karshbaum. Richard's son, Ronald and wife, were leaders of the Shadylane Hillbillies at the same time. Ronald's daughter, Roxie, was a member of the Shadylane Hillbillies. Roxie later became a leader for the Lima Lads and Lassies for 11 years while her daughter lackie was a member. In time Jackie became the leader for the Lima Lads and Lassies while her sons Brett, Luke and Tyler were members.

While Jackie was a leader Wendy Brantner became a co-leader in 2008 and then the leader when Jackie left the club in 2013 and has remained the leader since that timer. Back in the early 1981 Wendy's mom, Barb Merker, was a volunteer for the Lima Lads and Lassies while her two older sisters, Julie and Tricia, were members.

Sami and AJ's parents, TJ and Sarah, were also past 4-H members. TJ was a member from 1988-1996. His mom, Pat Poeschel, was a club volunteer. Sarah was a member from 1994-2003.

Jodi Vetterkind's family has a long history of 4-H involvement also. Jodi's greatgrandma, Aileen Wayne, was a clu'b leader for Lima Lads and Lassies while her son, John, was a member. Later John enrolled his daughter, Kristen, who is Jodi's mom in the Shadylane Hillbillies 4-H club.

In 1981 Rosemary Achenbach was honored for 30 years of volunteering in the 4-H program while her children all were enrolled in the Lima Lads and Lassies 4-H club. Her daughter, Mary, later became a volunteer for the Senior Youth Council of 4-H while her three daughters, Julia, Sarah and Marsha were members of the Lima Lads and Lassies. Mary and her husband Dale still volunteer to make rosettes for the Lima Lads and Lassies annual Christmas Cookie bake sale. Dale and Sarah have continued to enter projects in the Open Class Division of the fair.

 - b. What are you most proud of and why?
- Parent and/or 4-H Club Leader Statements Please have your parent and/or 4-H Club Leader write a few sentence about their thoughts of your 4-H journey this year. The statement should be signed by the Parent or 4-H Club Leader.


