It is up to the 4-H member to fill out the proper paperwork and get her project to the fair and retrieve it. So that is what her family set out to do. At the state level Alivia earned a 5th place standing for her project. Congratulations Alivia!!

Usually our monthly meetings are on Sundays but most everyone had other things going on that day so we postponed our meeting to Monday August 17th. This is our end of 4-H year meeting. Anyone that completes a 4-H Record Book needs to hand that in at this time. We recap how the fair went for everyone and talk about what they are looking forward to next year. Then we try to do a special fun activity. We decided to play kickball at Memorial Park. It was a beautiful evening and we had lots of fun. We capped off the night with bowls of ice cream.

July is a busy month for the Lima Lads and Lassies in getting ready for the fair. At our regular monthly meeting on July 19th we met at Wendy's house. The goal was to figure out how to decorate the barn boards that go up in the barn where our animals will be housed during the fair. We also planned out our design for our fair booth also so it coincides with the barn boards.

July 26 is fair ground set up day. All of the display shelves and cases have to be dusted, wiped clean and put into place. Half of the clubs are asked to help on this day and our club is one of those clubs. Wendy, Celsey, Ryker and Maverick were able to help out with his job. Thank you to the Pepin County Dairy Promotion Council for donating pudding that was leftover from the dairy breakfast to the lunch that was provided to all the families that came to help with the set up.

The theme was "Where Town and Country Come Together". All of our decorations are based on that theme. All exhibits have to be checked in by 2:00 on the 29th so the fair can officially begin. Dylan and Drew Jereczek entered beef. Jacey and Corrina Brunner, Jodi Vetterkind, and Sami and AJ Poeschel entered sheep. Jacey Brunner entered a rabbit. A new member to our club this year was Willa Brenner and she entered a pig. These projects are a huge time commitment and dedication to taking care of an animal. Four of these members had an animal in the meat auction on Friday night. All four of them did very well at the auction. Dylan's steer was purchased by First Choice Dairy Supply for \$9.25/lb. Drew's steer was purchased by Komro Sales for \$7.50/lb. Jacey Brunner's sheep was purchased by Johnson Tractor for \$17.00/lb. Willa Brenner's pig was purchased by Komro Sales for \$16.00/lb. Jacey also earned 4th place in the Herdsmanship judging. Thank you so much to the businesses that purchased these animals from the exhibitors!!! Many of our club members earned Merit Awards on their projects. Some even earned Best Of Show or Reserve Best of Show. It's always so exciting to see what color ribbon was attached to your project after the judging is complete. That rounded out our fun for July and the first weekend in August. See you at the fair next year!!

We started out August with a donation of a book bag full of the basic necessities to start school to the National Night Out event which will be August 4th.

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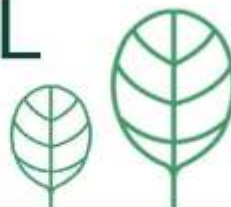

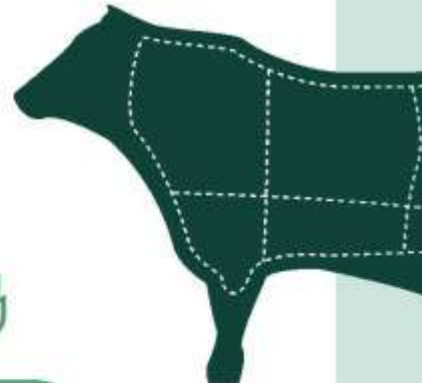

YA Youth as Partners in Civic Leadership (YPCL), groups of youth and adults who work together as leaders in local schools, communities, and organizations gather for youth-led workshops about community service, civic engagement, health, and relationships. 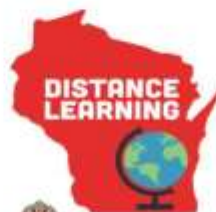

JAMES W. CROWLEY DAIRY LEADERSHIP AWARD

Named in honor and memory of James W. Crowley, a longtime Extension Dairy Specialist and strong supporter of the dairy youth project, this award provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their Dairy Project. Eligibility for this award includes: current enrollment in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership, must be in grades 10-13 as of January 1, and should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project. Fifteen state awards are to be presented and recognized with a plaque annually to outstanding 4-H Dairy Project members. The top three youth will each receive \$1,000 cash awards. Youth that have received a plaque only are encouraged to apply again. Additionally, the top awardee that is a Junior in high school as of January 1, 2025 is offered a \$5,000 scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison and enroll in the Department of Dairy and Animal Sciences.



Applications open **May 1** and are due **June 10**.
